Read each of the following situations and provide the correct response in French.

1. You walk into a beach-side bar and grill and see some of your friends there already. How do you greet them?
2. You go to a Tourist Information Office. Ask the receptionist if he/she has any brochures with information on the area.
3. Order a drink at a French restaurant.
4. You are a receptionist at Bread & Breakfast. Someone has just come in and asked for the location of room number 12. Tell him that room number 12 is the door on the left.
5. You are unable to understand an item on a French Menu. Ask the waiter for an explanation.
6. A fellow guest at your hotel asks for direction to the Dining Room. Tell her to walk straight ahead and then turn right.
7. A gentleman calls to speak to your manager who is out of his office. The gentleman would like to leave his number so your manager can get in touch with him, upon his return. Take down the number according to the following « un, quarante-cinq, vingt-deux, quarte-vingt quatoze, trente huit »
8. You are visiting your aunt in Martinique. You have run out of Euro currency and would like to change \$1,000 EC dollars which you have on your person, to Euros. Ask your aunt where the bank is located.
9. After a most exciting vacation in Paris, you have returned home and are in the process of telling your friend about it. Tell her that there are lots of things to see or do in Paris.
10. You are seated at a French restaurant for dinner. Tell the waitress that you have neither a fork, nor a knife.

- G : (Say yes. Thank you very much sir.)

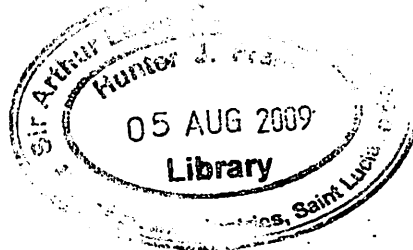
