IN THE CARIBBEAN**

5. Eighty per cent of all females arrested in Jamaica and Guyana in the period 1999-2009 were arrested for drug trafficking. This represented an increase of 22 per cent in drug-related arrests among women. This increase signalled a rise in international drug trafficking among women aged 18-25 who accounted for 95 per cent of the offenders. CARICOM is now interested in comparing these findings with those from a similar study to be conducted in Trinidad and Tobago and Barbados.
- (a) Identify TWO sources from which information may have been obtained for the research conducted in Jamaica and Guyana. [2 marks]
 - (b) Identify TWO ethical issues that may have arisen in the conduct of this research. [2 marks]
 - (c) Outline TWO limitations that may have been encountered in the process of conducting this research. [4 marks]

 - (e) State TWO ways in which data from this study may be presented. [2 marks]
 - (f) Explain TWO reasons why the proposed study would be important to CARICOM governments. [4 marks]
